This **Mallard** Family (*Anas platyrhynchos*) was seen at King George V Pool, Altrincham. Captions please! The pool is an artificial lake constructed in 1910 - 1911 from a former clay-pit, to celebrate the coronation of King George V. It was given as a gift to the people of Altrincham by Lord Stamford in memory of the reign of the King. The pool is about 2.5 acres, fed from Timperley Brook and now managed both for wildlife and for fishing. It is surprising the variety of flora and fauna that can be seen here so close to dense habitation. It is one of the special places providing sanctuary for many of us during the lockdown of 2020.

Marsh Helleborine (*Epipactis palustris*) As with many orchids, the attractive features often remain hidden until you move very close – the frilly white lip is only about 0.5cm across. It is found mostly in calcareous habitats and particularly dune systems. Where it does occur, it can be quite common, as it is here in the dunes of the Sefton Coast near Ainsdale.

Scarce Silver-lines Moth (*Bena bicolorana*) One of the few species of green moths in Britain. Distributed widely but locally across England and Wales as far north as Yorkshire. The larva feeds mainly on oak leaves and disguises itself accordingly. In summer it is small and green, changing in autumn to pale brown with a dark brown saddle to match a leaf bud or scar. At bud burst in spring it becomes green with reddish brown stripes resembling an expanding oak bud. Once the tree is in leaf it becomes all green again. The adults generally fly from June to August.


